PADIS is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week to answer any questions about poisons, chemicals or toxins you may have come into contact with.

What to do when you call

- Have the poison, chemical or toxin container with you if possible, or take note of how it looked
- Listen carefully to instructions
- Ask questions if you don't understand
- Follow the advice of the PADIS expert, and head to the hospital if advised

Be prepared to answer questions about:

- The condition of the person exposed to the poison, chemical or toxin
- What and how much product was involved
- Information from the container label or a description of the substance
- The involved person's name, sex, age and weight

The PADIS expert will then recommend first aid treatment or connect you with immediate medical attention, if needed.

If the individual is unconscious, not breathing, or having a seizure call 911 immediately.

PADIS is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week to answer any questions about the medications, drugs or herbals you may be taking.

Why call?

- When you need more information on the drugs you are taking and the possible side-effects, interactions or risks
- When you've found conflicting information on the web or from a friend and you want to find out more from an expert
- When you can't get in touch with your doctor, nurse practitioner, or other health care provider to ask questions about your medications or how they are affecting your health

We provide information about:

- Prescription and over the counter medications
- Herbals
- Vitamins and supplements
- Birth control

We provide advice about:

- Using medications and herbal supplements while pregnant or breast feeding
- Herbal supplement safety or interactions with prescription medication
- How best to take your medicine

What is PADIS?

The Poison and Drug Information Service is a multidisciplinary team of experts specially trained in poisons, toxins, drugs and medications. PADIS is always ready to respond to emergencies and answer questions.

This team of experts:

- Has been educated and trained in dealing with various herbs, chemicals, plants and natural toxins
- Can assess and evaluate your situation in a timely manner
- Will research the most up-to-date information to provide you with timely, appropriate advice for your situation
- Will provide ongoing support and follow-up until the situation is resolved
